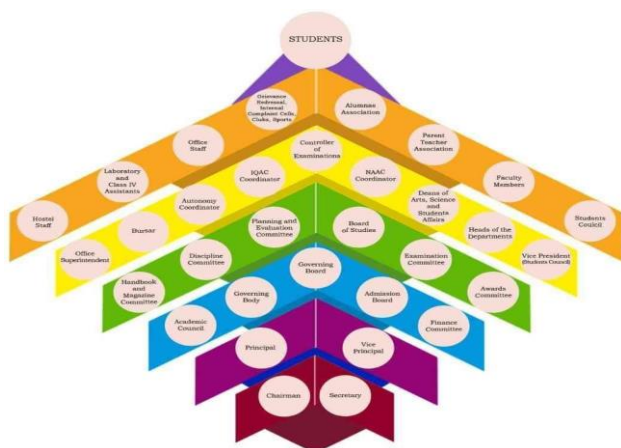

Mechanism for Good Governance

The institution has a democratic and decentralized governance system which allows all the stakeholders to actively participate. The college has a Governing Body, Financial Committee, Academic Council, Board of Studies and office of the CoE that monitors, audits, regulates and implements decisions. The Governing Board formulates all the rules and regulations for the faculty and the students. It meets once/twice in a year and manages the college on behalf of the university for the benefit of the students. The Governing Body meets once/twice in a year to enhance and maintain the academic standards of the college. The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) is responsible for planning, designing, supervising, maintaining and monitoring the quality systems of the institution. The Academic Council meets regularly, makes all the crucial decisions and takes necessary steps to implement strategic plans to enhance the quality of teaching and learning.

The institution involves all the stakeholders in drafting the perspective plan such as construction of new buildings and improvement of the scope and profile of the Teaching-Learning Experience.

The Heads of Departments and the Coordinators of various clubs and cells form a backbone for the effective functioning of the institution. The Heads of Departments are

engaged in regular review regarding academics, research, placement and routine activities of the department. Action plan is formulated by the Principal and HoDs under the direction of the top management, taking into consideration the inputs of the stakeholders. These plans are periodically reviewed and effectively implemented with the support of faculty members and non teaching staff for the welfare of students. Student Feedback on Institutional Governance/faculty performance Grievance redressal mechanism for faculty, staff and students

Student Feedback on Institutional Governance/faculty performance

1. Feedback about the Faculty is taken from students. The various parameters on which teaching is assessed are: Communication Skills, Quality of Teaching/ Academic input, Subject Knowledge, Content and Method of Delivery, Resourcefulness, Readiness of teacher, Accessibility and Availability of Teacher in Campus/ Department.
2. Alumni Feedback is taken from Alumni for each academic year. The analysis helped the institute in developing a curriculum that satisfied the needs of the society and industry.
3. An Institute level Parent Teacher meeting is conducted once or twice in a year. During the meeting, parents are made aware about their wards' attendance, academic performance for the semester as well as about the various learning processes conducted in the institute. The parents' meeting will be conducted as a general one as well as at the department level. Suggestions given by parents were taken into consideration for further actions. Also this helped in identifying the parents who would help in providing support to the institute for the improvement of physical amenities.
4. Feedback about Institute and Curriculum is taken from all students once or twice in a year. This helps in revising the curriculum and updating it according to the needs of the students and society.
5. Various companies visit the campus of the institute for the placement of the students. Based on this feedback, Guest lectures, workshops, seminars are organized for students to help them to be ready for industry.

Establishment of Anti Ragging Committee

Our college is a reputed women's college which has a history of more than a century. 
